

HOW WE GOT HERE

Two years ago Dr. Howard Bixby—ChristWay Ministries consultant—was invited to evaluate our church, and offer biblical suggestions of how we can grow in faithfulness. His primary feedback was for us to gain clarity on where we are going as a church. We took that advice to heart and as Pastors and Deacons began meeting weekly. We prayed a lot, studied the Scriptures, and asked hard questions. Over the course of a year or more God began to provide clarity to us as leaders. From that point, we started sharing this information with small groups and getting feedback from various individuals. In the Fall, we preached twelve sermons providing a biblical foundation for our newly crafted mission statement, as well as our nine value statements. The hope of this sermon series was to share clearly where we think God is leading our church and invite the congregation to join us in this new season of ministry.

Along the way, we have been encouraged to hear that many resonate with the mission, and are excited about what is ahead. Some have even gone so far as to say that the mission and values are nothing new, but rather a continuation of what church leadership always wanted to do.


We are thrilled with where the Lord is leading us, and we look forward to the coming years as we pursue our mission together.

We hope that in this report you see how our mission played out in 2021 and how it will impact 2022.







I needed help. I remember telling God, I want to try it Your way now. Looking back, I realize God wasn't punishing me growing up over the years, but He was teaching me that I always had His love; I didn't need to earn His favor. It's a freeing feeling to know that now.

I was running myself into the ground and in my foolishness, God came closer to me and grabbed me by the scruff of my shirt and said to me, "I will not lose you; you are mine", and He claimed me as His. Since then, my lifestyle and thinking has changed. I now know the legalistic mindset is not the way to perceive God's love. It's only by God's grace through faith that we are saved. I want everyone to know that I will not arrive to perfection, but I will continue to grow and learn with Christ forever.

I grew up in Sunday School, sang in the choir, became a church elder and treasurer, but didn't live my life as an example of a Christian. My marriage suffered and I felt I was not a good father. My religious beliefs were that I had to earn my way to heaven by good works. Obviously, that was never going to happen, so I thought I was doomed to Hell. It wasn't until we went to a concert at a Baptist church when I was asked if I knew Jesus, not about Him, but personally. They said we could ask Him into our life. So I did. We started attending West Windsor Baptist Church, where we heard the clear message of the gospel and joined a small group. All of these things came together and helped me realize that I was not going to Hell because of my sins, but rather Jesus died for me because of sin, and I needed Him because of my sin.

I was born into a Christian family and baptized as an infant. I taught Sunday School in the Nursery and did so until COVID-19 closed the church down. For 35 years I worked for a company doing customer service and insurance billing. During this time, I did some things that didn't feel right; I signed documents that were half-truths. This caused inner conflict which, I believe, led to my heart attack and the need for open heart surgery. Before the surgery, the doctor came in and told me he didn't think that I would make it through. My great-nephew prayed for me that night, and after everyone left, I cried and prayed, telling God how much I loved Him and trusted Him with my life. Since then, I've learned a lot about myself and what my relationship with God was and what it wasn't. I believe I was trying to earn my way to God's love and salvation. I've learned that God's love is free through His grace. And now I can say that I know that I am a Christian.

My teenage years were dark, indeed. By the time I got through them, I'd had several major car accidents, a few of which I had no right to expect to live through. My 20s and 30s went from bad to worse. Everything in my life was a loss. I was lost. I was a drunkard, carouser, adulterer through my 40s and 50s, running as far away from the Lord as I possibly could. I finally hit rock bottom when an infection was discovered in my left knee and I had to have several surgeries to avoid amputation. I had a lot of time to think about how I had lived my life and how I wanted to write the last chapter of my life. The loneliness and despair broke me. I cried to the Lord, "Help me Jesus. I don't know how to deal with this other than with You". I didn't think there was any way He could forgive me from my lifetime of sin, but He was the only hope I had. So I threw myself on His mercy. I came to Jesus with nothing and He's changing me. He has set me free from the law of sin and death. I am no longer a slave of sin, I am free at last!

REPORTS

DEACONS

Deacons serve at WWBC by assisting the Pastors in serving the church body. Deacons are chief servants who lead by serving, and our Deacons were happy to serve in 2021. They met with the Pastors almost every week throughout the year, praying for the congregation, assisting in shepherding the flock, and giving insight into strategic initiatives. The Deacons look forward to serving God and His church in 2022.

Strategic Initiatives in 2021

- Helped the Pastors navigate COVID-19 and reopening strategies
- Developed and presented a new Mission, Values, and Vision for WWBC
- Implemented a new Deacon Training and Vetting process, and saw our first two candidates go through the process: Jeremy Snavelly and Scott Reigle
- Assisted in the hiring of an Administrative Assistant, a Worship Intern, and a Custodian
- Assisted the Pastors in developing and implementing Gospel Essentials and Church Essentials
- Formed a Prayer Team to pray for the congregation at the end of the worship services
- Distributed funds to those in need throughout the year, and worked on developing a Mercy Fund Policy that will hopefully help more people in 2022 and beyond
- Assisted the Pastors in many other strategic initiatives throughout the year





TRUSTEES

The Trustee Board at WWBC is responsible for the church finances and assets, as well as the building and grounds maintenance.

Each member of this team brings a unique set of gifts and abilities that in turn allows us to better serve the church. The Trustees met monthly throughout the year, as well as having monthly joint meetings with the Pastors and Deacons. The church finances have remained strong throughout 2021, this a testament to your faithful giving and support of the ministry. One of the major ministries the Trustees helped to facilitate was writing and implementing a new Facility Use Policy, which helped our facilities be used frequently by our congregation and our community.

Strategic Initiatives in 2021

- Developed and implemented a new Facility Use Policy
- Allowed our church families to use our facilities for more than 215 hours in 2021
- Allowed our community to use our facilities for more than 235 hours in 2021
- Also hosted 2 weddings, 2 funerals, and 8 additional showers/parties in 2021
- Developed a job description and hired a new custodian
- Replaced a failing air conditioning unit
- Replaced the water softener in the parsonage
- Sealed the parking lot
- Installed a dry well outside of the car port
- Projects currently in progress are: access control, and projector and screen upgrades

YOUTH MINISTRY

Our WWBC Youth Ministry exists to train and equip teenagers to grow in loving God, loving people, and making disciples of Jesus. Our Wednesday night Youth Group consists of age-appropriate Bible lessons, small group discussions, snacks, and games. Our Sunday morning Teen Sunday School consists of intentional time of prayer and Bible discussion. We also hosted numerous on-site and off-site youth events throughout the year. 2021 saw so many instances of heartfelt conversations, intentional prayer and investment, and unsaved friends invited to hear about Jesus, and we look forward to even more that God has for us in 2022.



The purpose of Sunday Morning Kids Ministry at WWBC is to create an environment that will lead children in growing their relationship with Jesus. Nurturing children is vital to fulfilling our personal and corporate mission to love God, love people, and make disciples of Jesus. In Kids Church, adults impact the lives of children by sharing lessons from the Bible and teaching how each story has a Christ connection. Volunteers also direct questions in small group settings and apply principles of love during interactive sessions that include crafts and games. Above all, Kids Ministry seeks to glorify God by communicating Biblical truth through age-appropriate instruction.

It is such a blessing and privilege to minister to our littlest ones! How precious it is to see the toddlers eager-eyed as they handle the little New Testaments, listen expectantly during Bible story time, and pray fervently as they repeat prayers! Even at a young age, Preschoolers are asking deep questions like, 'Is everyone who comes to church a Christian?' They are being introduced to Bible truths such as sin, the Holy Spirit, baptism, and that living the Christian life is sometimes dangerous and hard, but as one Preschooler answered, 'God is always with us.' It is an extra special blessing, especially with the new curriculum, to incorporate a missions moment and the gospel regularly. SMALL GROUPS

WHAT'S NEXT



TEACHING

During the winter and spring semester, the Pastors plan to teach through the book of 1 Timothy in our Sunday morning corporate worship gatherings.

1 Timothy was written by the Apostle Paul to his mentee Timothy as he launched him into ministry at the church of Ephesus. This letter was intended to encourage Timothy to face the challenges that plagued the Ephesian church, as well as provide guidance about how the church of Jesus Christ was meant to operate.

We are calling this series 1 Timothy: The Life of the Church. Our hope for this series is to learn about God's design for the church both generally and specifically. We will cover topics such as prayer, church governance, men and women's roles, work, money, homosexuality, and more. We believe this series will help us gain clarity on what God wants us to do and how to grow in our faithfulness toward Him.

MISSION AND VALUES INCORPORATION

As we discussed above, 2021 was a big year for establishing and explaining our mission and values. We hope that 2022 is a fruitful year of working with ministry leaders to determine how the mission and the values of the church should shape and impact various ministries.

ORDINATION

In January of 2021, our Assistant Pastor, Christian Mickey, began an intentional ordination process. Ordination is a training and vetting process to determine a man's qualifications, gifting, and calling to be a pastor. Since 2017, as an Assistant Pastor (or pastor in training), Christian has been learning, growing, and gaining experience. In 2022, we hope to walk him through a comprehensive vetting process that will include a public oral examination.

We are very proud of Christian, impressed with his hard work, encouraged by his love for God, and blessed by his gifts. We hope this is a wonderful year for Christian, his family, and the church family as we encourage him in the next step of ministry and spiritual formation.

There are no specific dates yet, but we expect this process to really ramp up in the summer or fall.

DEACON TRAINING

2021 was the first year a formal deacon training and vetting process was launched. Two men—Jeremy Snavely and Scott Reigle—went through the whole process and will be voted on as deacons at the annual meeting. In 2022, we plan to invite several more individuals to participate in the process. We hope that God will provide for His church more trained and qualified deacons by the end of the year.



GOSPEL ESSENTIALS

In 2021, sixteen people were taken through Gospel Essentials. Gospel Essentials was written by the pastors of the church as a discipleship experience to help those new to our church take first steps toward spiritual growth and church involvement. The heart of Gospel Essentials is to teach the essence of the good news of Jesus Christ and the many ways that it applies to life. We used 2021 as a test year to see how it works and if it would be helpful. We are encouraged with how God is using it.

In 2022, we hope to continue those efforts by adding facilitators, guiding more participants, and developing a clear pathway that helps new attenders get plugged in and growing.

In addition to Gospel Essentials, we hope to start testing Church Essentials. Church Essentials is being designed to help those who participated in Gospel Essentials learn more about what it means to be a part of a church and how to get deeply involved. The hope is that the material development is completed and individuals are taken through it at some point this year.

WEBSITE

One way we hope to improve our communication efforts is by better utilizing our website. We are in the process of re-designing our current website to make it more useful and helpful for ministry and communication.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

Capital Projects consist of church assets that cost more than \$2,000. These projects are either necessary in order to maintain the property, or are strategic projects that we believe will enhance ministry effectiveness. There are several capital projects that are being proposed for the 2022 budget, but we would like to highlight a few that we believe will enhance ministry effectiveness.

Confidence monitors, livestream upgrades, and worship center lighting upgrades are three projects that we believe will improve our corporate worship gathering. One of our values is “God is worthy of worship”. We believe there is value in utilizing technology to create helpful and distraction-free worship environments. We hope all of these efforts will help our worship leaders better lead in corporate worship, and better call the congregation to participate—whether that be online or in-person.
